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Executive Summary

Pursuant to Government Code section 70352 (c), the Judicial Council is required to submit a report on the actual expenditures from the Court Facilities Trust Fund to the Legislature after the end of each fiscal year. On December 31, 2020, the Judicial Council's Budget Services staff submitted the 2019-20 Court Facilities Trust Fund Expenditures, which reported the fund expended \$125.3 million in 2019-20.

Relevant Previous Council Action

These reports are submitted to the Legislature annually. Reports from previous fiscal years are available on the California Courts website "Legislative Reports" webpage at www.courts.ca.gov/7466.htm.

Analysis/Rationale

The annual submission of this report to the Legislature is required under Government Code section 70352(c). The statute requires that the Judicial Council submit the actual expenditures from the Court Facilities Trust Fund. According to Government Code section 70352(b), "Money deposited in [the Court Facilities Trust Fund] and appropriated by the Legislature shall be administered by the Judicial Council for the operation, repair, and maintenance of court facilities and other purposes provided by statute." In 2019–20, the fund expended \$125.3 million for these purposes as identified in the categories listed in the table below:

Pursuant to Government Code section 70352(c), the Judicial Council is submitting the report on the actual expenditures of the Court Facilities Trust Fund for fiscal year 2019–20.

Government Code section 70352(b) states, "Money deposited in [the Court Facilities Trust Fund] and appropriated by the Legislature shall be administered by the Judicial Council for the operation, repair, and maintenance of court facilities and other purposes provided by statute." In 2019–20, the fund expended \$125.3 million for the purposes shown in the table below.
