Executive Summary

Senate Bill X1 2, signed into law by Governor Gavin Newsom on February 7, 2025, amends the Budget Act of 2024 to augment the Equal Access Fund by \$5 million to be distributed by the Judicial Council to the California Access to Justice Commission. The commission will distribute the funds as a one-time expansion of the commission's grants to nonprofit providers of legal services. Due to the high priority the Legislature has given this augmentation, staff recommends that the Judicial Council approve the distribution of this funding, as required by Senate Bill X1 2 through this circulating order process.

Recommendation

Judicial Council staff recommend that the Judicial Council, effective February 14, 2025, approve the distribution of the \$5 million augmentation to the Equal Access Fund to the California Access to Justice Commission, as directed by Senate Bill X1 2.

Relevant Previous Council Action

The Judicial Council has approved the distribution of Equal Access funds consistent with the state Budget Act to the California Access to Justice Commission since fiscal year 2021–22. Most recently, the Judicial Council distributed and approved the allocations of the Equal Access funds authorized in the Budget Act of 2024 in September 2024.

Analysis/Rationale

Since 2021, the state Budget Act has provided that \$5 million be distributed by the Judicial Council to the commission for grants to nonprofit civil legal aid providers, to be used to support the infrastructure and innovation needs of legal services in civil matters for indigent persons. The commission may use up to 2.5 percent of these funds for administrative costs associated with distributing and monitoring the grants (Link A).

On November 7, 2024, Governor Gavin Newsom issued a proclamation to convene an extraordinary session of the California Legislature to support and fund certain legal and administrative actions such as those included in Senate Bill X1 2 (Link B). Senate Bill X1 2 amends the Budget Act of 2024 to augment the Equal Access Fund by \$5 million for distribution by the Judicial Council to the California Access to Justice Commission.

The commission will distribute the funds as a one-time expansion of the commission's grants to nonprofit providers of legal services. In passing the legislation, both houses of the Legislature approved a Letter to the Journal further clarifying their intention in how the funding should be used. (Attachment A.) When he signed the bill, the Governor issued a signing message stating his intent as well. (Attachment B.)

Due to the high priority the Legislature has given this augmentation, staff recommends that the Judicial Council approve the distribution of this funding to the California Access to Justice Commission on an expedited basis.²

Judicial Council staff will report to the Judicial Council on the commission's distribution of funds and, as required by Senate Bill X1 2, will also submit a mandated report to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee on the grant awardees, grant amounts, and grant period.

Policy implications

The recommendation implements legislation and supports Goal I of *The Strategic Plan for California's Judicial Branch*—Access, Fairness, Diversity, and Inclusion—by increasing representation for low-income persons.

To the Members of the California State Senate:

I am signing Senate Bill X1 2, which will bolster funding for legal services programs that are vital to safeguarding the civil rights of California's most vulnerable residents, including people with disabilities, youth who are homeless, victims of human trafficking and wage theft, people facing unlawful evictions, immigrants and more.

None of the funding in this bill is intended to be used for immigration-related legal services for noncitizens convicted of serious or violent felonies. To the extent further clarification is necessary, I encourage the Legislature to pass subsequent legislation providing that this funding is to be allocated consistent with the restrictions set forth in paragraph 3 of subdivision (b) of Section 13303 of the Well are and Institutions Code.
