

Goal of Language Access Implementation: Equal access to justice for nearly 7 million Californians who are limited-English speakers

#### Challenges:

- Limited funding
- >210+ languages
- Differing trial court needs


Context: California is one of several states facing this challenge, but none has the scale of California

## Budget and LAP Monitoring Subcommittee


To date, the interpreter fund has grown from \$95.8M to \$108.9M

2018 Budget also includes ongoing support for signage and non-VRI technology

We need to build on this foundation



## Civil Expansion Progress




## Ongoing Monitoring and Data Collection

- Bi-monthly meetings with the courts' Language Access Representatives
- Complaint process (Rule 2.851)
- Annual online survey conducted by Language Access Services
- Changing metric tracked from "interpretations" to "cases"
- Updates to CIDCS, including interpreter portal
- Tracking new case types
- Developing a metric to track unmet need



- Pilot program on digital translation at the counter




Following a live hearing, Judge Bacciarini interacts with interpreter Rosa Lopez via video remote interpreting equipment in Merced County

# LAP Implementation: 39 of 75 LAP Recommendations Completed to Date

#### Examples of completed projects:

- Establishment of Language Access Toolkit
- Designation of Language Access Representatives
- Notice for court users in multiple languages
- Interpreter request form
- Interpreter recruitment recommendations
- Signage recommendations



## Recommended Next Steps

- New standing Language Access Subcommittee of the Advisory Committee on Providing Access and Fairness
- Ongoing partnership with the Court Interpreters Advisory Panel on language access issues
- Focus on remaining LAP recommendations, such as data collection, monitoring, and development of additional resources for LEP court users and courts
