### Executive Summary

On January 1, 2023, the Judicial Council's Center for Families, Children & the Courts submitted to the Department of Finance *Equal Access Fund Evaluation Report: January 1–June 30, 2022*, which outlines expenditures and activities, highlighting outcomes and impacts of the Equal Access Fund. The report was provided to the Judicial Council by the Legal Services Trust Fund Commission of the State Bar of California.

### Relevant Previous Council Action

On October 1, 2021, the Judicial Council approved the fiscal year 2021–22 distribution of Equal Access Funds to legal services providers and support centers, as recommended by the Legal Services Trust Fund Commission and in accordance with the statutory formula in the Budget Act.

### Analysis/Rationale

The Budget Act of 2021 (Sen. Bill 129; Stats. 2021, ch. 69) appropriated over \$70 million from the General Fund and over \$5 million from the Trial Court Trust Fund to the Judicial Council for the Equal Access Fund. Of these funds, nearly \$63 million was allocated through the Legal Services Trust Fund Commission for grants to civil legal services providers and support centers.

The funds are distributed primarily in two parts: IOLTA (Interest on Lawyers' Trust Accounts) Formula Grants and competitive Partnership Grants. More than \$58 million was allocated to 103

IOLTA-Formula Grants for “legal services in civil matters for indigent persons” and \$5 million to 53 Partnership Grants for “joint projects of courts and legal services to programs to make legal assistance available to pro per litigants.” (Sen. Bill 129, Item 0250-162-8506, Provision 1.) Funding may be used for up to two years (depending on the grant type), through December 2023.

The 2021 Budget Act added a new reporting requirement:

The State Bar of California shall annually provide to the Judicial Council a report that includes funding allocations, annual expenditures, and program outcomes by service area, and service provider for all Equal Access Fund and federal funding. Data shall be reported using the established reporting framework in the Equal Access Program including applicable outcome measures reported in Legal Services standardized reporting, state level performance measures, and main benefits scores. The Judicial Council shall provide the report to the Department of Finance by January 1 of each year for the prior fiscal year.

(*Id.*, Provision 4.)

This is the first required annual report, covering activities, outcomes, and expenditures through June 2022.

### **IOLTA-Formula Grants**

Although services funded by IOLTA-Formula Grants spanned a broad range of legal issues, most closed cases related to housing, immigration, and domestic violence. Legal outcomes (main benefits) of the services included avoiding the need for litigation, settling legal precedent, accessing clients’ rights to the justice system, and obtaining clients’ monetary benefits.

In the first six months of this two-year grant cycle, IOLTA-Formula projects already closed nearly 15,000 cases, assisting nearly 15,000 indigent persons, a majority of whom were women and a majority of whom were Hispanic. Of these closed cases, funded programs achieved legal outcomes (main benefits) for over 9,600 clients (64 percent). Additionally, these programs assisted nearly 60,000 indigent persons through nearly 1,300 other services, including self-help clinics, educational workshops and trainings, outreach events, and hotline calls. These levels of service and outcomes are particularly notable given the ongoing pandemic restrictions and resultant need to shift from in-person to remote outreach and services.

In addition to individual services, grant funding to legal support centers enabled subject-matter experts to provide training on the latest legal developments, brief consultation, in-depth technical assistance, and other support to direct service providers.

### **Partnership Grants**

Legal services agencies provide self-help assistance in partnership with a state superior court. Fifty-one grant projects were funded. The top four focus areas for Partnership Grant projects were housing, family, domestic violence, and civil harassment. In the first six months of the

grant, programs provided over 21,000 services, which ranged from information on legal options through the court process to posttrial/hearing preparation.

### **Fiscal Impact and Policy Implications**

Findings contained in this report will have no direct fiscal effect on the courts. Nevertheless, courts will indirectly benefit from assistance provided to self-represented litigants. The Equal Access Fund assists the judicial branch in implementing Goal 1 of its strategic plan—Access, Fairness, and Diversity—by increasing representation for low-income persons.

## EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

In 1999, the California Legislature established the Equal Access Fund (EAF), with the goal “to improve equal access and the fair administration of justice.” Since its inception, EAF has grown significantly from its initial appropriation of \$10 million in 1999 to its most recent appropriation of \$58 million in 2022.

A study on access to justice conducted by the State Bar in 2019 revealed that in a given year, more than half of California households experience civil legal issues but receive no help, or inadequate help, for 85 percent of these problems. Due to this justice gap, a significant proportion of the most vulnerable Californians are not receiving much-needed legal assistance. EAF is critical to legal aid and providing access to justice for vulnerable Californians who are unable to afford an attorney. Legal aid intervention helps keep Californians in their homes, maintain employment, improve health outcomes, and become better advocates for themselves.

In 2022, the State Bar awarded over 81 nonprofit organizations whose primary purpose is to provide free civil legal services to indigent people in California and 22 organizations whose primary purpose is to provide legal training, legal technical assistance, or advocacy support to the organizations that provide direct legal services to indigent people. Organizations that provide direct legal services are called Qualified Legal Service Projects (QLSPs) and organizations that support QLSPs are called support centers (SCs). Recipients of EAF grants must use the funds to support an identified set of activities with measurable outcomes.

EAF<sup>1</sup> is distributed in two parts: (1) 90 percent of the funds are distributed according to the statutory Interest on Lawyers’ Trust Account (IOLTA) formula<sup>2</sup> and (2) 10 percent of the funds are distributed as Partnership Grants—discretionary grants for joint projects between court and legal service programs to provide legal assistance at or near courthouses to pro per litigants. Unlike the general EAF grant that is distributed to IOLTA-eligible organizations through a statutory formula based on qualified and county expenditures (EAF–IOLTA), Partnership Grants are awarded through a competitive process. EAF–IOLTA and Partnership Grants are typically awarded over a one-year period commencing January 1.

Pursuant to new reporting requirements under the State Budget Act of 2021, this report provides an overview of expenditures and activities and highlights outcomes achieved and the impact of EAF–IOLTA and Partnership Grant funds during the six-month reporting period of January 1–June 30, 2022.

## **Key Findings**

- EAF–IOLTA-funded organizations closed 14,938 cases for 14,783 indigent persons, a majority of whom were women and Hispanic.
- Organizations were able to recover \$24,140,694 for clients and save clients \$1,455,676.
- EAF–IOLTA-funded organizations assisted 59,949 indigent persons with other services, including self-help clinics, educational workshops and trainings, outreach events, and hotline calls.
- Most Partnership Grant projects used remote services for self-represented litigants (SRLs) in one-on-one services and group-setting services. This change in service delivery model is significant, as remote services were not previously used and may have been attributable to COVID-19.

## PROGRAMS AND PROJECTS FUNDED

For the 2022 grant year, EAF–IOLTA distributed over \$58 million to 103 organizations (81 QLSPs and 22 SCs) and \$6.46 million<sup>3</sup> to 51 Partnership Grant projects. In the first six months of 2022, organizations spent \$18,901,932<sup>4</sup> of the EAF–IOLTA distribution and \$1,484,410 of the Partnership Grant distribution.

Notably, organizations were able to use the EAF to increase staff salaries and/or benefits. This is significant because increasing compensation directly impacts an organization’s ability to recruit and retain staff, which enables it to maintain a high level of service delivery for its clients.

## CASES CLOSED

Organizations reported on 14,938 EAF–IOLTA-funded closed cases<sup>5</sup> provided to low-income people, seniors, and people with developmental disabilities in California during the first six months of 2022.

## LEVEL OF SERVICE AND NUMBER OF SERVICES

Across all areas of law, assistance for EAF–IOLTA-funded cases were mainly through the limited-service case categories of counsel and advice (7,102) and limited-action (3,925) matters.<sup>6</sup>

Due to an unanticipated increase in EAF in 2022, the State Bar administered another cycle of Partnership Grants, named Partnership Grants 2.0, which supplemented existing 2022 Partnership Grant projects and funded new 21-month projects, which began April 1, 2022, and will end on December 31, 2023. Because of the overlapping grant administration timelines during this reporting period, information for both grants are included in this report.

<sup>5</sup> For reporting purposes, “Case” is defined as a legal problem of a client (attorney–client relationship) and the legal activities or processes used in resolving those problems, which could be limited or extended services. “Closed Case” refers to a case where there is a resolution of the client’s problem, or where the client’s problem is not resolved but it is determined that no further action will be taken on the case.

<sup>6</sup> “Counsel and Advice” includes preparing and providing advice to the client reviewing relevant information and counseling the client on how to take action to resolve the issue. “Limited Action” refers to services provided to a client that involved preparation of relatively simple or routine documents and relatively brief interactions with other parties. Examples include preparing short letters and drafting a routine will or power of attorney.

Most cases were closed in the areas of housing (3,372), immigration (2,241), and domestic violence (2,127).

- Housing matters include federally subsidized housing rights, foreclosure or title fraud, landlord–tenant (including foreclosure evictions), public housing, and homelessness.
- Immigration matters include naturalization, asylum, adjustment of status, citizenship, family petition, special immigrant juvenile status, and trafficking T and U nonimmigrant-status visas.
- Domestic violence matters include abuse perpetrated against any of the individuals identified in the Domestic Violence Protection Act, California Family Code §6211.

## CASE OUTCOMES: MAIN AND ECONOMIC BENEFITS

Organizations reported on main benefits (outcomes from a legal issue) and economic benefits (financial award or savings for the client)<sup>8</sup> achieved for each EAF–IOLTA-funded cases closed during the reporting period for people in California who are low income, who are seniors, and who have developmental disabilities. These main benefits were developed through a collaborative process with the legal services organizations and synthesize the most common goals of legal services in different case types. Main benefits also frequently go beyond costs recovered, such as clients being able to stay housed, having access to quality and affordable health, and obtaining other legal protections.

Across all areas of law, organizations reported 9,611 benefits for 13,617 people in households, resulting in \$24,140,694 recovered and \$1,455,676 saved for clients.

The highest number of benefits were reported in access to justice (2,130), family/domestic violence (1,752), and housing (1,952).

- Access to justice benefits generally occur when advocacy results in a measurable benefit different from those in a specific area of law. These benefits include avoiding the need for litigation, setting legal precedent, and accessing client’s rights to the justice system.
- Family/domestic violence benefits include obtaining protection from abuse or neglect, obtaining, preserving, or increasing child support, and obtaining a temporary restraining order (TRO) under the Domestic Violence Prevention Act (DVPA).
- Housing benefits include obtaining access to housing, enforcing rights to safe and habitable housing, and obtaining relief from foreclosure or property scam.

<sup>8</sup> Due to the different types of legal issues in each substantive area, not all main benefits result in an economic benefit. Economic benefits are typically obtained and reported in the areas of consumer/finance, employment, family/domestic violence, health and long-term, income maintenance, and miscellaneous.

From January 1–June 30, 2022, organizations recovered nearly \$24 million for clients through back awards, lump sum, settlement or monthly benefits in the areas of housing (\$8.96 million), consumer/finance (\$7.67 million), and family/domestic violence (\$2.47 million).

- Housing economic benefits recovered for clients include amounts of any cash settlement or judgment, including moving expenses or return of disputed (or undisputed) security deposit, as well as the value of retaining voucher or other housing subsidy.
- Consumer/finance economic benefits recovered for clients include amounts recovered for creditors and amounts of any cash settlement or judgment.
- Family/domestic violence economic benefits recovered for clients include orders for monthly amount for child or spousal support over a set amount of time.

<sup>10</sup> “Total Number of Benefits” is the aggregated number of benefits as reported by the organizations and may not necessarily match the specific number of benefits associated with economic benefits.

<sup>11</sup> Consistent with the California Legal Aid Reporting Handbook, family and domestic violence benefits were combined so organizations can easily report multiple benefits that overlap across the two substantive areas. However, both areas of law remain separate for reporting closed cases.


## CASES CLOSED: CLIENT DEMOGRAPHICS<sup>12</sup>

For all 14,938 EAF–IOLTA closed cases, organizations reported on demographic information collected for clients served, in categories such as gender, race and ethnicity, and age. Across all organizations, EAF–IOLTA cases mostly assisted women and people who identify as Hispanic.

### Gender

For the reporting period, EAF–IOLTA closed cases served more women (59 percent) than men (39 percent).


**Figure 2. Client Demographics: Gender**



### Race and Ethnicity

EAF–IOLTA-funded closed cases primarily served Hispanic (38 percent), white (26 percent), Asian or Pacific Islander (13 percent), and Black (12 percent) clients during the reporting period.

## OTHER SERVICES

In addition to receiving case assistance, legal aid organizations provide other services in instances where no attorney–client relationship is formed through self-help clinics, educational workshops, outreach events, and hotline calls. Organizations continually try to address the justice gap through these other services. For example, in self-help clinics and educational workshops, people have the opportunity to ask questions and gain a basic understanding about their civil legal issues, enabling them to feel empowered and more confident in the legal system. In outreach events, organizations frequently engage with community partners, which can be impactful in reaching vulnerable communities and connecting people to more integrated services.

From January 1–December 31, 2022, EAF–IOLTA-funded organizations provided 1,282 other services to approximately 59,949<sup>14</sup> people.

- Most self-help clinics were held in the areas of domestic violence (134), conservatorships (114), and employment (54).
- Most educational workshops and trainings were held in the areas of disability rights (172), immigration (58), and housing (47).
- Most outreach events were held in the areas of access to justice (117), employment (70), and miscellaneous (68).
- Most hotline calls were for issues involving domestic violence (1,909), housing (1,353), and conservatorships (898).

## PARTNERSHIP GRANT SERVICES

Partnership Grants require legal aid organizations to collaborate with court-based self-help centers to expand the types of services available to low-income SRLs. Through this relationship, legal aid organizations and courts leverage their respective expertise and experience to identify and develop solutions to help address challenges faced by those who are low income. Another benefit of Partnership Grants is that they help streamline and make court processes more efficient, enabling more SRLs to be served.

Organizations reported on services provided for their entire projects during the first six months of 2022 across all sources of funding. Although more than half of the Partnership Grant projects are funded by additional funding sources, the reported numbers below reflect services funded by Partnership Grants. In order to determine what portion of services are attributed to Partnership Grant funding, a pro-rata amount was calculated by dividing Partnership Grant expenses by current expenditures for the entire project. Services provided under the Partnership Grants are in addition to the self-help other services funded by EAF–IOLTA.

- In 2022, 51 Partnership Grant projects were funded. Of that total, 36 projects were awarded for the grant year, January 1–December 31, 2022, and 15 projects were awarded Partnership Grants 2.0 for the grant year, April 1, 2022–December 31, 2023.
- The top three focus areas for Partnership Grant projects during the reporting period were housing (21), family (18), and domestic violence and civil harassment (17).
- Across all projects, SRLs sought the most assistance in obtaining information on general court processes and procedures (5,425), obtaining information on substantive legal options (4,771), and document preparation and/or review (4,752).
- In addition to providing one-on-one services<sup>17</sup> to SRLs, Partnership Grant projects held 1,048 workshops, which assisted 2,413 litigants.

## SUPPORT CENTERS

Approximately 20 percent of all EAF–IOLTA grantees are SCs. The primary purpose of SCs is to provide legal training, legal technical assistance, or advocacy support to the organizations that provide direct legal services to indigent people. SCs are subject-matter experts that keep up with the latest developments in the law and help distill it for direct service providers to put into practice. They also advocate and help shape the law so it is beneficial to vulnerable communities.

During the reporting period, EAF–IOLTA-funded SCs provided the following modes of assistance:

- **Training Events:** SCs held a total of 151 training events across 11 areas of law. Most trainings were focused on housing, health and long-term care, and immigration.
- **Consultation and Technical Assistance:** Brief services/consultation were the most requested by QLSPs at 51 percent,<sup>18</sup> followed by extensive, in-depth assistance at 31 percent, and research at 18 percent. Most QLSPs were assisted in the areas of housing and health, and long-term care.
- **Meetings:** Meetings, such as stakeholder convenings, are important for SCs to learn about the latest updates in their specific areas of law, as well as share those updates with QLSPs. During the reporting period, SCs organized or participated in a total of 601 meetings. Meetings with the most QLSP attendees were in the areas of miscellaneous,<sup>19</sup> housing and health, and long-term care.
- **Advocacy Support at the Request of a QLSP:** SCs provided advocacy support in 10 different areas of law, with the most in employment, housing, and immigration. Most advocacy support was administrative or legislative advocacy.

## LANGUAGE ACCESS

Organizations had the most capacity to offer Spanish for EAF–IOLTA activities (89 of 103) and Partnership Grant projects (47 of 51). Translation services were also mostly in Spanish.

- Across all EAF–IOLTA activities, organizations reported having a total 894 bilingual staff and volunteers, of which 512 were funded by EAF–IOLTA funds.
- For language assistance beyond staff expertise, organizations use interpreters or work with community partners.
- After Spanish, Mandarin and Cantonese were the most frequently needed for language assistance.

## IMPACT OF COVID-19 PANDEMIC

Most organizations indicated that the pandemic had a significant impact both on service delivery and staff during the reporting period. For EAF–IOLTA and Partnership Grants, most organizations saw a decrease in the in-person events than previously held, experienced staffing issues, and indicated that the clients’ limited access to technology also impacted services.

## LESSONS LEARNED

This report provides an initial understanding of the tangible impact that the EAF has on vulnerable Californians and on legal services providers. In addition to reporting specific outcomes, organizations also reflected on some lessons learned after the first six months of the grant period:

- **Remote and hybrid services have been critical for clients.** To better serve those who have health concerns around COVID-19, limited transportation options, or difficulty leaving due to child or elder care, organizations are embracing technology to reach more people and to streamline processes, such as filling intake forms, making appointments, or having meetings.
- **Data has been important in understanding the impact of services and determining whether changes are needed.** Organizations rely on public data and client feedback to assess their impact and adjust accordingly. Many are improving their databases and exploring options to receive more feedback from their clients.
- **Organizations are striving to make legal services, resources, and information more accessible to their client communities.** Organizations are trying to make information more accessible to their client communities by translating resource materials into different languages, updating websites for easier navigation for information and resources, and summarizing complex presentations in large settings, and sharing specific customized details when meeting with an individual.
- **Organizations are working to improve organizational capacity to match the growing demand for legal services.** Organizations have hired more staff and provided trainings to support and retain employees. They have also partnered with other organizations and firms to help with the need for services.
- **Limited access to technology still remains a significant issue for clients, especially those in rural communities.** In addition to providing hybrid services and communicating over the phone, organizations are working to build relationships with those who have technological challenges.

We anticipate that these outcomes and lessons learned will help organizations improve the quality and delivery of much-needed civil legal services for the remaining grant year.
