Executive Summary

As outlined in the California Rules of Court, rule 10.11, the Executive and Planning Committee oversees the Judicial Council's meeting process and operating procedures, including agenda setting for council meetings, development of the council's long-range strategic plan for the judicial branch, and development of policies and procedures related to court facilities and communications with the branch. The committee is also charged with directing the nominations process for vacancies on the council and its advisory bodies and education curriculum committees and overseeing specific advisory bodies. This report summarizes the committee's activities since the last Judicial Council internal committee written report, which was submitted for the council's January 20, 2023, business meeting.

Agenda Setting and Other Business

Since the Judicial Council's January 20, 2023, business meeting, the committee met once by videoconference on February 22, 2023, to set the agenda for the council's March 24, 2023, business meeting. During the same meeting, the committee also conducted additional business as summarized on the next page.

Appellate Caseflow Workgroup: Recommendations

The committee reviewed recommendations from the Appellate Caseflow Workgroup that the Executive and Planning Committee refer 9 of the 22 recommendations in the workgroup's final report to the Appellate Advisory Committee and the Center for Judicial Education and Research Advisory Committee. The committee approved the referral as follows:

- 8 recommendations to the Appellate Advisory Committee for review, research, and consideration; and
- 1 recommendation to the Center for Judicial Education and Research Advisory Committee for review and research.
