Executive Summary

The Rules Committee establishes and maintains the Judicial Council rule-making process and assists the council in making informed decisions about rules of court, forms, standards of judicial administration, and jury instructions. Among other actions, the committee "[r]ecommends whether the council should approve, modify, or reject each proposal." (Cal. Rules of Court, rule 10.13(c)(1).) This report describes the committee's activities since the July 21, 2023, Judicial Council meeting. These activities include the committee's recommendations for council approval of the rules, forms, and jury instructions proposals identified below, all of which are on the council's consent agenda for the September meeting.

Overview of Committee Meetings

Since the council's last meeting, the Rules Committee has acted once by videoconference and three times by email.

On **July 31, 2023**, the Rules Committee acted by email on one proposed report to the council from Judicial Council staff proposing the amendment of several rules of court to implement recent legislation regarding remote appearances in civil matters, enacted in Senate Bill 133 (Stats. 2023, ch. 34) and effective when signed by the Governor.

Action: The Rules Committee approved the proposal, which went to the Judicial Council via circulating order number CO-23-02.

On **August 11, 2023**, the Rules Committee acted by email to review one proposed invitation to comment to circulate on a special cycle, with a proposal from the Civil and Small Claims Advisory Committee and the Family and Juvenile Law Advisory Committee to adopt two new forms, *Request for Sheriff to Serve Court Papers* (form SER-001) and an attachment to that form, *Special Instructions to Serve Court Papers* (form SER-001A).

Action: The Rules Committee approved the invitation to comment (SP23-06), which was posted for public comment through September 5.

On August 22, 2023, the Rules Committee met by videoconference to consider:

Action: The Rules Committee approved all the proposed reports to go forward to the council's consent agenda for the September 19 meeting.

On **August 28, 2023**, the Rules Committee acted by email to a request from the Appellate Advisory Committee to amend its current annual agenda to allow it to work on a joint proposal with the Criminal Law Advisory Committee to implement the Racial Justice Act, which work needs to be done now if the committees are to circulate a proposal for comment in the winter cycle.

Action: The Rules Committee approved the request to amend the annual agenda.

Recommendation to the Judicial Council

The Rules Committee recommends council approval of the rules, forms, and jury instructions recommendations in the reports approved by the committee on August 22. All of these proposals are on the council's consent agenda for the September meeting.
