## Executive Summary

Pursuant to Government Code section 77202.5(a), the Judicial Council is required to submit a report on allocations and reimbursements to the trial courts to the Senate Committees on Budget and Fiscal Review and Judiciary, and the Assembly Committees on Budget and Judiciary, annually by September 30 of each year. On September 29, 2023, Judicial Council staff submitted the report on 2022-23 Allocations and Reimbursements to the Trial Courts.

## Relevant Previous Council Action

This report is submitted to the Legislature annually. Reports from previous fiscal years are available on the California Courts website "Legislative Reports" webpage at www.courts.ca.gov/7466.htm.

## Analysis/Rationale

The allocations and reimbursements from state and federal funds include (1) 2022-23 base allocations for court operations; (2) reimbursements for specific trial court expenditures including, but not limited to, jury, self-help center, court interpreter, and court-appointed dependency counsel costs; (3) fee revenue amounts that are distributed directly back to the reporting courts as authorized in statute or by the Judicial Council; and (4) funding awarded to individual trial courts from statewide programs, including state and federal grants.

A total of $\$ 3.1$ billion was provided to the trial courts from the following funds (Attachment A):

- Trial Court Trust Fund ( $\$ 2.8$ billion);
- State Court Facilities Construction Fund ( $\$ 50.0$ million);
- State Trial Court Improvement and Modernization Fund (\$9.2 million);
- General Fund ( $\$ 221.5$ million); and
- Federal Trust Fund ( $\$ 1.5$ million).

The report also includes a statement of the intended purpose for which each allocation or reimbursement was made (Attachment B) and the policy governing trial court reserves, which are authorized pursuant to Government Code section 77203 (Link A).

Trial Court Trust Fund (TCTF)

| C | 2022-23 Equity Funding of \$100m | $\$ 100$ million equity funding was to bring courts below the statewide funding level average as close to the statewide average funding level as calculated for 2022-23 (each court was brought up to the same Workload Formula percentage). |
| D | 23 New Judgeships Funding | This allocation reflects a portion of funding to support new judgeships (to bring cluster 1 courts to 100 percent funding, for courts that are below statewide average funding, and for courts that are below 100 percent funding). |
| E | 23 New Judgeships Non-Sheriff Security (1.12 Percent) | This allocation reflects a portion of funding to support 23 new judgeships non-sheriff security. |
| F | 2022-23 Non-Interpreter Benefit Cost Change Funding | This allocation is for 2022-23 full-year cost changes for retirement, employee health, and retiree health for noninterpreter employees. |
| G | 2022-23 Civil Assessment <br> Redistribution | This allocation is for redistribution of \$59.3 million funding for civil assessment. |
| H | Reduction for SJO Conversion (Annualization) | This allocation reflects an annualization portion for 2022-23 from the conversion of a subordinate judicial officer (SJO) position into a judgeship that occurred in 2021-22. |
| I | 2022-23 Non-Court Interpreter Benefit Augmentation | This adjustment is for a current year augmentation of 2022-23 non-court interpreter benefits. |
| J | Final Reduction for Fund Balance Above the 3 Percent Cap | This allocation is a reduction to courts for any amount of their 2021-22 ending fund balance subject to the 3 percent fund balance cap (Gov. Code, $\S 77203(b))$ in excess of the cap as required by Government Code section 68502.5(c)(2)(A). |
| K | TCTF Funds Held on Behalf of the Trial Courts Returned to Courts | This allocation reflects funds returned to the trial courts for those courts with approved TCTF funds held on behalf of trial courts' requests, based on the process approved by the Judicial Council at its April 15, 2016 business meeting. |

| Q | Children's Waiting Room | This allocation was for costs of operating a children's waiting room (except capital outlay). |
| R | Fee Revenues Returned to Courts | This allocation was for revenues returned to courts for various local fees charged by courts based on the cost of providing a service or product. |
| S | Replacement of 2 Percent Automation Fund Allocation | This allocation replaced funding previously provided from the 2 percent automation revenues deposited into the Trial Court Improvement and Modernization Fund. The allocation amounts by court are specified in Government Code section 77207.5. |
| T | Telephonic Appearance | This allocation was to provide courts the amount received in 2009-10 from telephonic appearance revenue-sharing arrangements with vendors, as required by Government Code section 72011. |
| U | Court-Appointed Counsel | This allocation was for reimbursement of court-appointed dependency counsel expenditures. |
| V | Court-Appointed Counsel DRAFT | This allocation reflects expenditures and encumbrances for reimbursement of court-appointed dependency counsel costs for courts participating in the Dependency, Representation, Administration, Funding, and Training (DRAFT) program, in which the Judicial Council contracts with dependency counsel on behalf of specific courts. |
| W | Jury | This allocation was for reimbursement of eligible juror costs. |
| X | Juvenile Dependency Counsel Collections Program | This allocation was for reimbursement of court-appointed dependency counsel expenditures from monies collected through the Juvenile Dependency Counsel Collections Program. |
| Y | Juvenile Dependency Counsel Collections Program (JDCCP) DRAFT | This allocation reflects expenditures and encumbrances for reimbursement of court-appointed dependency counsel costs from funding collected through the JDCCP for courts participating in the DRAFT program. |
| Z | Elder Abuse | This allocation was for reimbursement of costs related to protective orders involving elder or dependent adult abuse. |
| AA | Self-Help Centers | This allocation was for reimbursement of expenses charged in accordance with each court's intra-branch agreement for self-help center funding. |

| AH | Civil Case Coordination | This allocation was for reimbursement of the cost of handling coordinated cases. |
| AI | Family Law Information Centers | This grant allocation reflects expenditures and encumbrances for costs related to projects in the Los Angeles, Sutter, and Fresno Superior Courts, which assist more than 45,000 low-income, self-represented litigants with forms, information, and resources in family law matters. |
| AJ | Model Self-Help | This grant allocation reflects expenditures and encumbrances for pilot self-help centers that provide self-represented litigants various forms of assistance, such as basic legal and procedural information, help filling out forms, and referrals to other community resources. |
