Executive Summary

Government Code section 69958 requires the Judicial Council to report to the Legislature semiannually on the purchase and lease of any electronic recording equipment that will be used to record superior court proceedings. During the reporting period of January 1 through June 30, 2021, four courts reported spending a combined total of \$235,571 for equipment or related items.

Relevant Previous Council Action

These reports are submitted to the Legislature semiannually. Previous reports can be found on the "Legislative Report" page of the California Courts website at <u>www.courts.ca.gov/7466.htm</u>.

Analysis/Rationale

Government Code 69957(a) allows the purchase and/or lease of electronic recording equipment for limited civil, misdemeanor, infraction, and small claims cases. Additionally, Government Code section 69957(c) requires the courts to obtain advance approval from the Judicial Council before purchasing or leasing any such equipment. Approval is subject to the equipment being used in the manner and for the purposes authorized under this section.

From January 1 through June 30, 2021, four courts spent a combined total of \$235,571 for equipment or related items:

- Contra Costa Superior Court spent \$212,202 to purchase electronic recording equipment for use in small claims, infractions, misdemeanors, and limited civil case types (see Attachment A).
- Stanislaus Superior Court spent \$300 to purchase four audio mixers to pair with the court's Liberty Recorder software to digitally record courtroom audio (see Attachment B).
- Mono Superior Court spent \$14,985 to purchase three For the Record (FTR) Touch– Digital Court Reporter systems for official records in small claims, misdemeanors, and limited civil case types (see Attachment C).
- Shasta Superior Court spent \$8,084 to purchase electronic recording equipment for use in small claims, misdemeanors, and limited civil case types (see Attachment D).

In addition to the items reported above, Judicial Council staff was informed on June 8, 2021 that the San Diego Superior Court spent \$80 during the prior reporting period July 1 through December 31, 2020, to purchase a Sony PX series digital voice recorder to record a judge's orders for civil proceeding case types in open court for a judge who has since retired, and the item is no longer in use (see Attachment E).

The semiannual submission of this report to the Legislature is required under Government Code section 69958. The statute requires that each superior court report to the Judicial Council the purchase and lease of all electronic recording equipment that will be used to record court proceedings, specifying all of the following:

- The superior court in which the equipment will be used;
- The types of trial court proceedings in which the equipment will be used;
- The cost of purchasing, leasing, or upgrading the equipment; and
- The type of equipment purchased or leased.

Fiscal Impact and Policy Implications

The requirements of this report do not result in any additional costs or operational impact.

Dear Ms. Jenkins, Ms. Contreras, and Ms. Parker:

Pursuant to Government Code 69958, the Judicial Council is submitting the semiannual *Report of Electronic Recording Equipment Purchased or Leased by Superior Courts*, for the reporting period of January 1 through June 30, 2021.

Government Code 69957(a) allows the purchase or lease of electronic recording equipment for limited civil, misdemeanor, infraction, and small claims cases. The report specifies the name of the court, types of proceedings for which the equipment will be used, cost of the equipment, and types of equipment purchased or leased.

Additionally, Government Code section 69957(c) requires the courts to obtain advance approval from the Judicial Council before purchasing or

leasing any such equipment. Approval is subject to the equipment being used only in the manner and for the purposes authorized under this section.

During the January 1 through June 30, 2021 reporting period, four courts spent a combined total of \$235,571 for equipment or related items:

- Contra Costa Superior Court spent \$212,202 to purchase electronic recording equipment for use in small claims, infractions, misdemeanors, and limited civil case types. An itemized list can be found in Attachment A.
