Appointed by the Chief Justice in March 2021

- Examine successful court practices adopted during the pandemic
- Recommend practices that demonstrate the most promise to:
 - increase access to justice
 - modernize services
 - promote consistency throughout the state



Information Gathering Process

- 14 Workgroup meetings with presentations from a wide variety of branch stakeholders
 - What was working on the ground
 - What should be continued past the pandemic
 - Focus on improving services to court users



Overall Themes

- Desire for consistent court practices and procedures within individual courts, as well as among trial courts throughout the state.
- Greater access to the courts is desired, as is the ability to have multiple ways to access court services. It would be a mistake for the courts to return to "standard operating procedures".
- With few exceptions, presenters spoke of the value in continuing to provide court users with remote access in all case types.



Developing Concepts

- Invited Judicial Council Advisory Committee Chairs to dialogue with the Workgroup about the preliminary direction the Workgroup was headed.
- Committees provided valuable input to help finalize the Workgroup's recommended concepts.
- Depending on the specific concept, the Workgroup asked the respective advisory committee to consider developing a rule of court, proposing legislation, and/or developing best practices.

- Virtual Visitation

- Increased Remote Access Between Defense and In-Custody Clients
- Disaster Readiness: Checklist for Future Emergencies



Next Steps

- Follow up with Advisory Committee on Concepts
 - Workgroup-led concepts
 - Next Workgroup interim report ways to improve the juror experience and the jury selection process
 - Spearhead the work on Code of Civil Procedure section 367.9
