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### Executive Summary

This informational report to the Judicial Council is of aggregate demographic information concerning the gender, race/ethnicity, sexual orientation, gender identity, and veteran and disability status of California's justices and judges by specific jurisdiction, which council staff is required by statute to collect and release annually. In general, findings indicate that the California bench has become more diverse over time.

### Relevant Previous Council Action

In 2006, Senate Bill 56 (Dunn) authorized 50 new judgeships in California and amended Government Code section 12011.5(n) to require the Judicial Council to collect and report on the demographics of the bench in the aggregate. The council has collected and released this demographic data since 2007, with the most recent information release occurring on March 1, 2021. Currently, section 12011.5(n) requires that the council report on the composition of the bench by race, ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity, and veteran and disability status. Data pertaining to veteran and disability status has been collected since 2014, as a result of an expansion of the legislative mandate for the collection of demographic data from new justices and judges. Similar reporting requirements apply to the Governor and the Commission on Judicial Nominees Evaluation of the State Bar of California.

## Analysis/Rationale

The information in the attached charts reflects justices and judges on the bench as of December 31, 2021, who have reported demographic background information. In general, findings indicate that the California bench has become more diverse over time.

The charts show:

- The overall gender, race/ethnicity, sexual orientation, and gender identity of responding justices and judges in the Supreme Court, Courts of Appeal, and trial courts;
- The gender of these justices and judges by jurisdiction (Supreme Court, Courts of Appeal by district, and trial courts by county);
- The race/ethnicity of responding justices and judges by jurisdiction;
- The specific race/ethnicity reported by those justices and judges who indicated that they consider themselves to be of more than one race/ethnicity;
- The sexual orientation and gender identity of responding justices and judges by jurisdiction;
- The veteran and disability status of responding judicial officers new to the bench, beginning in calendar year 2014; and
- Comparisons of the current overall data on gender, race, and ethnicity with data from prior years' reports.

The most recent demographic data reflect changes resulting from judicial retirements and other departures from the bench, new judicial appointments, and an increase in the number of trial court judges who have provided race/ethnicity information.

The demographic data indicate a trend toward a greater proportion of women serving as trial court judges over time. At the end of calendar year 2021, women responding to the demographics survey represented 38.4 percent of this component of the judiciary, compared to 27.1 percent at the end of 2006, continuing an upward trend across this time period.

The data also show an increase in the total number of responding judges since 2006 in the following race/ethnicity categories: American Indian or Alaska Native, Asian, Black or African American, Hispanic or Latino, Pacific Islander, and more recently in the category of More than One Race. In addition to increases in the foregoing categories, a steady decrease was observed among judges in the response categories of White and Information Not Provided.

Of the 707 trial court judges responding to the question about their veteran status, 50 respondents (7 percent) indicated that they served in the military. Further, of the 744 judges responding to the question concerning their disability status, 17 judges (2 percent) indicated that they have a disability. Finally, 1,336 judicial officers responded to the question regarding their sexual orientation and gender identity, with the majority of respondents answering that they are heterosexual (73.9 percent). ## **Fiscal Impact and Policy Implications**

There are no costs to the courts for the annual collection and release of demographic data on justices and judges. The release of this descriptive information is in response to a legislative mandate for descriptive demographic data, and on that basis is not intended to directly impact state or council policy.

**Race/Ethnicity Categories**

The category descriptions are adapted from definitions used by the U.S. Census Bureau in Census 2010 and again in 2020, with the 2010 census being the first in which respondents were invited to identify more than one category.

*American Indian or Alaska Native*: A person having origins in any of the original peoples of North and South America (including Central America), and who maintains tribal affiliation or community attachment.

*Asian*: A person having origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, or the Indian subcontinent. The category includes persons who indicate their race as Cambodian, Chinese, East Indian, Filipino, Japanese, Korean, Malaysian, Pakistani, Thai, or Vietnamese.

*Black or African American*: A person having origins in any of the black racial groups of Africa.

*Hispanic or Latino*: A person of Cuban, Mexican, Puerto Rican, South or Central American, or other Spanish culture or origin, regardless of race.

*Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander*: A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Hawaii, Guam, Samoa, or other Pacific Islands.

*White*: A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Europe, the Middle East, or North Africa.
