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Executive Summary

As outlined in the California Rules of Court, rule 10.11, the Executive and Planning Committee oversees the Judicial Council's meeting process and operating procedures, including agenda setting for council meetings, development of the council's long-range strategic plan for the judicial branch, and development of policies and procedures related to court facilities and communications with the branch. The committee is also charged with directing the nominations process for vacancies on the council and its advisory bodies and education curriculum committees, and overseeing specific advisory bodies. This report summarizes the committee's activities since the last Judicial Council internal committee written report, which was submitted for the council's December 2, 2022, business meeting.

Agenda Setting and Other Business

Since the Judicial Council's December 2, 2022, business meeting, the committee met once by videoconference on December 13, 2022, to set the agenda for the council's January 20, 2023, business meeting. During the same meeting, the committee also conducted the additional business as summarized on the next page.

Conversion of limited-term subordinate judicial officer position to permanent position, supporting Pretrial Pilot Program: Superior Court of Sacramento County

During its December 13, 2022, meeting, the committee reviewed and approved a recommendation from Office of Court Research staff to confirm a request by the Superior Court of Sacramento County for authorization to convert a limited-term subordinate judicial officer (SJO) position to a permanent SJO position serving in support of the court's Pretrial Pilot Program.
