Executive Summary

Government Code section 69958 requires the Judicial Council to report to the Legislature semiannually on all purchases and leases of electronic recording equipment that will be used to record superior court proceedings. During the January 1 through June 30, 2019, reporting period, the Superior Court of Mendocino County spent \$10,651 to purchase For the Record (FTR) Gold software and Microsoft Surface Pro tablets. These purchases were approved by Judicial Council staff on March 11, 2019 and will help facilitate the court's official record keeping in small claims, misdemeanor, and limited civil cases.

Relevant Previous Council Action

These reports are submitted to the Legislature semiannually. Previous reports can be found at www.courts.ca.gov/7466.htm.

Analysis/Rationale

The semiannual submission of this report to the Legislature is required under Government Code section 69958. The statute requires that each superior court report to the Judicial Council "all purchases and leases of electronic recording equipment that will be used to record superior court proceedings, specifying all of the following:

(a) The Superior Court in which the equipment will be used.

- (b) The types of trial court proceedings in which the equipment will be used.
- (c) The cost of purchasing, leasing, or upgrading the equipment.
- (d) The type of equipment purchased or leased."

Fiscal Impact and Policy Implications

Implementing the recommendations in this report has no additional costs or operational impacts.

Dear Ms. Boyer-Vine, Ms. Contreras, and Ms. Parker:

Pursuant to the requirements under Government Code 69958, the Judicial Council is submitting the report on the purchase or lease of electronic recording equipment during the period of January 1 through June 30, 2019.

As required by statute, for each purchase or lease of equipment, the report specifies the name of the court, types of proceedings for which the equipment will be used, cost of the equipment, and types of equipment purchased or leased.

any electronic recording technology or equipment. Approval for purchase or lease of the equipment is subject to the equipment being used only in the manner and for the purposes authorized under that section. During the January 1 through June 30, 2019, reporting period, the Superior Court of Mendocino County purchased electronic equipment or related items for use in court proceedings.

Government Code 69957(a) allows for the purchase and or lease of electronic recording equipment for limited civil cases or misdemeanor or infraction cases. The Superior Court of Mendocino County spent \$10,651 to purchase For the Record (FTR) Gold software and Microsoft Surface Pro tablets. These purchases, which were approved by Judicial Council staff on March 11, 2019 help facilitate the court's official record keeping in small claims, misdemeanor, and limited civil case types. An itemized list of the Superior Court of Mendocino County's purchases can be found in Attachment A.
