# **Executive Summary**

Pursuant to the Budget Act of 2020, Item 0250-113-0001, Provision 3, the Judicial Council is required to submit quarterly reports to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee on the estimated amount of General Fund required to backfill the Trial Court Trust Fund due to shortfalls in revenue to support trial court operations. This report is for the reporting period of April through June 2021. On or before July 30, 2021, the Judicial Council's Budget Services staff submitted the 2020–21 Trial Court Trust Fund Backfill Report, Quarter 4.

#### **Relevant Previous Council Action**

### Analysis/Rationale

The *Trial Court Trust Fund Backfill Report* is required pursuant to the Budget Act of 2020, Item 0250-113-0001, Provision 3, to be submitted on a quarterly basis to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee. The statute requires that the Judicial Council "submit quarterly reports that include, but are not limited to, the following: (a) the backfill required in the prior quarter based on the actual data, (b) the total backfill required under this item through the quarter covered by the

report, (c) an updated estimate of the backfill required in the following quarter, and (d) an updated estimate of the total backfill required in the fiscal year."

The actual revenues have improved as compared to the prior report, resulting in a revised estimated need of \$129.3 million. The prior report, 2020–21 Trial Court Trust Fund Backfill Report, Quarter 3, indicated a need of \$149.3 million.

The backfill needs are identified in the table below:

The Budget Act of 2020 included a revenue backfill of \$273.8 million to support the Trial Court Trust Fund, which is the primary fund source for trial court operations. This represents \$90.9 million for 2019–20 and \$182.9 million for 2020–21. As part of the approval of the backfill, the Legislature also required the Judicial Council to report quarterly on the backfill need.

A report was submitted to the Department of Finance (DOF) and the Joint Legislative Budget Committee (JLBC) on May 14, 2021 that was based on actual revenue data through February 2021. Discussions with the DOF and JLBC after the submission of the May report confirmed that the amount of the backfill request would be revised based on updated revenue information. Backfill estimates continue to be updated monthly. The 2020–21 estimated backfill amount included in this report is based on actual revenue data through April 2021. The final backfill amount for 2020–21 will be determined based on actual year-end revenues.

#### Fiscal Impact and Policy Implications

No costs or operational impacts will result from the submission of this informational report to the Legislature.
