#### **Executive Summary**

Pursuant to Government Code section 68502.6(d), the Judicial Council is required to report to the Legislature annually on all cash flow loans made to the courts. On August 30, 2021, Judicial Council staff submitted the report *Cash Flow Loans Made to Courts in 2020–21*.

#### **Relevant Previous Council Action**

#### Analysis/Rationale

The Judicial Council is required by Government Code section 68502.6(d) to provide the Legislature with an annual report detailing loans made from specified branch funds to trial courts. These loans are authorized pursuant to this section to support trial court operations in the event the cash balance in the Trial Court Trust Fund is insufficient.

### **Fiscal Impact and Policy Implications**

In 2020–21, 58 trial courts received a total of \$50 million in cash flow loans from the Immediate and Critical Needs Account within the State Court Facilities Construction Fund to the Trial Court Trust Fund. These loans were necessary to support trial court operations, including payroll

obligations. The attached report provides the list of courts that received loans, loan amounts, date the loans were made, planned repayment date, and funding source.
