Executive Summary

Pursuant to Government Code section 77202.5(a), the Judicial Council is required to submit a report on allocations and reimbursements to the trial courts to the Senate Committees on Budget and Fiscal Review and Judiciary and the Assembly Committees on Budget and Judiciary by September 30 of each year. On September 30, 2021, the Judicial Council's Budget Services staff submitted a report on the 2020–21 Allocations and Reimbursements to the Trial Courts.

Relevant Previous Council Action

These reports are submitted to the Legislature annually. Reports from previous fiscal years are available on the California Courts website "Legislative Reports" webpage at www.courts.ca.gov/7466.htm.

Analysis/Rationale

The allocations and reimbursements from state funds include (1) 2020–21 base allocations for court operations; (2) reimbursements for specific trial court expenditures including, but not limited to, jury, self-help center, court interpreter, and court-appointed dependency counsel costs; (3) fee revenue amounts that are distributed directly back to the reporting courts as authorized in statute or by the Judicial Council; and (4) funding awarded to individual trial courts

from statewide programs, including state and federal grants. Funding was provided from the following funds:

- Trial Court Trust Fund (\$2.2 billion);
- State Court Facilities Construction Fund–Immediate and Critical Needs Account (\$50 million);
- State Trial Court Improvement and Modernization Fund (\$12.4 million);
- General Fund (\$142.6 million); and
- Federal Trust Fund (\$1.8 million).

The report also includes a statement of the intended purpose for which each allocation or reimbursement was made and the policy governing trial court reserves, which are authorized pursuant to Government Code 77203.

Pursuant to Government Code section 77202.5(a), the Judicial Council is submitting the attached report on allocations and reimbursements to the trial courts in 2020-21.

The allocations and reimbursements from state funds include (1) the 2020–21 base allocations for court operations; (2) reimbursements for specific trial court expenditure items including, but not limited to, jury, self-help center, court interpreter, and court-appointed dependency counsel costs; (3) fee revenue amounts that are distributed directly back to the reporting courts as authorized in statute or by the Judicial Council; and (4) funding awarded to individual trial courts from statewide programs, including state and federal grants. Funding was provided from the following funds:

- Trial Court Trust Fund (\$2.2 billion);
