Executive Summary

The Administrative Director and Secretary of the Judicial Council (Administrative Director) recommends that the Judicial Council—by email action, via circulating order—approve, disapprove, or abstain from voting on the March meeting minutes and the recommendations in the reports linked below, which were scheduled to be considered on the consent agenda of the May 12–13, 2022, business meeting. Analysis/Rationale

The Administrative Director recommends that the Judicial Council—by email action, via circulating order—approve, disapprove, or abstain from voting on the March meeting minutes and the recommendations in the reports linked, which were scheduled to be considered at the May 12–13 business meeting on the consent agenda. Consent items represent many hours of work by the council's advisory committees and staff, and they bring substantial and significant recommendations and reports for consideration. Many of the recommendations have been circulated for public comment, and the comments have been reviewed by advisory committee members and, where appropriate, have resulted in changes to the proposals.

Additionally, the COVID-19 pandemic has allowed the judicial branch to explore marked improvements in business processes. The council intends to maximize the lessons learned during the COVID-19 pandemic, which mandated efficiencies in operations, including the use of remote and electronic means to conduct proceedings, such as Judicial Council meetings. Continued and regular use of technology, as appropriate, can increase transparency and efficiency and preserve public resources.

This circulating order will allow the council to carry out its policymaking role while members remain in their courts or offices to conduct business, which creates cost savings in travel, time, and resources. In addition, to preserve public access and the ability of the public to provide comments on the proposals, this circulating order was made available for public comment to the council from May 2 through May 6, 2022. No public comment was received by the established deadline.
